Kim is the daughter of James and Vickie Lenhart. Upon her death in an automobile accident in 1979 they established the Kim Lenhart Scholarship Fund to be administered by the Scholarship Committee of Morrison United Methodist Church.

Kim was an active member of Morrison and very involved in the Youth Fellowship, she was a bible student, a praying Christian and a tither. She was an honor student at Leesburg High School. She loved all animals but especially horses, was an excellent horse rider and a member of the pony club. Kim loved people, had many friends in all walks of life, and was noted for her kindness.
